<p><b>Coalition Updates – Kelly Stevens</b></p>	<p>Kelly discussed the recent Family Wellness Forum (Act with Respect Always with Coach Rich Johns) and that it was our biggest participation number to date with 27 attendees. The next Family Wellness Forum will be a <b>Right Under your Nose presentation by Patty Kilgore on November 20<sup>th</sup> from 5:30-7:00 pm at the SGF HS in room LGI.</b> Kelly is looking for volunteers to help direct guests where to go and to help with the bedroom. Kelly also announced that a date had been selected for the Communities Talk stipend (\$750) which the coalition received a few months back. In collaboration with the Saratoga County Sheriff’s Department, they will put together a panel of people all having been affected by driving while intoxicated. <b>This panel will present as an assembly on December 5<sup>th</sup> at the SGF HS.</b> All grades (9-12) will be required to attend with the first presentation at 8:30 am for grades 11-12 and the second at 1:00 pm for grades 9-10. Kelly also recapped the ACE Hardware Health and Benefits Fair and how it was very beneficial and targeted the coalition’s “dead zone.” In about one week, CCFW will have a live advertisement on the placemats at the Talk of the Town restaurant in Glens Falls.
