| <p>Member Spotlight – Bill Moon with Big Brothers Big Sisters of the Southern Adirondacks</p> | <p>Bill gave a brief overview of his role at BBBS as well as the organization’s impact on the SGF community. The Southern Adirondack division of BBBS involves a community program which includes 7 programs in 6 school districts with SGF School District being one. Bill explained the process for “matching” kids and that there is a system in place that finds the best matches based on a multitude of variables. One main component of BBBS is fundraising. One upcoming event is “Bowl for Kids’ Sake” to be held at Kingpin’s Alley in SGF on 3/22 at 12:30 pm, 3/28 at 6:30 pm, and 3/29 at 12:30 pm and 3:30 pm. Sponsorships are available for this event and a minimum of \$75 must be raised.
