








A er Prom Party

Rx Take Back

CCFW partnered with Moreau Emergency Squad and the Saratoga County Sheri 's O ce in October and May to remove unwanted, unused and expired medications from local households. Nearly 200 pounds of medications were collected from 100+ households. Community members were provided with free Deterra drug disposal kits, Lock Your Liquor Sti kers, a CCFW info card and promo items to take home.






Sledding & Hot Cocoa

Professional Development



- · Increase in healthy friendships


SEL and Prevention

Family Wellness Forum

CCFW teamed up with the South Glens Falls School District to host a live stream Family Wellness Forum to address adult substance misuse. The presentation featured 6 guest speakers including 4 specialists in the fiel of addiction





Preven on Campaigns

Lock Your Liquor

The Coalition developed a Lock Your Liquor Sti ker that can be placed on liquor bottles o deter youth from raiding the liquor cabinet.







6,000 sti kers were printed and distributed at outreach events throughout the year.

Stic er Shock

On July 29th Vanessa, Amber & Kelly placed stikers and bole neck hangers on alcohol for sale at 4 local retailers. This campaign is a reminder to adults not to buy alcohol for minors.





FDA Digital Calendars

17 digital calendars were hand delivered to all convenience stores and smoke shops within our catchment area. These calendars assist cashiers in determining the birth day and year required for someone to purchase tobacco products. When displayed prominently near the cash register, the calendars serve as a deterrent to underage buyers.





Deterra Drug Deac va on System

Deterra pouches deacti ate medications and provide an environmentally friendly method of disposal. In addition to providing free pouches at outreach events, CCFW has maintained a supply of pouches at Hannaford Pharmacy, Moreau Community Center, SGF Village Hall, the Town of Moreau o es, Moreau Health, the SGF Kindness Closet and Moreau EMS.



Data Collectio

Preven on Needs Assessment

The PNA survey was conducted among 7th -12th grade students in South Glens Falls in the Spring of 2021. The PNA assists the School District and the Coalition in identi ying areas of opportunity in which

to focus prevention e orts. The survey not only reports on substance use, it also analyzes an -social behavior as well as community risk and protecti e factors.



Community Scan

On July 13th—14th the New York Nationa Guard Counterdrug Task Force completed a Community Scan of South Glens Falls, Gansevoort and Moreau. The Task Force looked at areas identifie as potential hot spots for underage substance use and provided recommendations to deter future use in these locatio s.



Law Enforcement Collabora on

Compliance Checks

In April the Saratoga County Sheri 's O ce and the State Liquor Authority conducted alcohol sale compliance checks at 50 locations county-wide. A list of businesses in our catchment area was provided to the Sheri 's o ce prior to the checks. 6 businesses in our area were non-compliant and sold alcohol to a minor.



Protecti g Youth

The CCFW Youth Coalition met with Moreau Community Center Executi e Director and founding CCFW member, Donna Nichols in early summer 2021 to propose a new youth space at the Center. The proposal was met with high enthusiasm and was approved by the MCC Board of Directors that same day. Coalition sta , youth members and MCC staff spent the summer renovating a room at the Community Center and purchasing furniture & supplies for the new space.

The Bulldog Zone drop-in youth center opened on September 21st 2021.
